1	BCPL/C&P/01966/LE18S222MD/5100001851	24.07.2018	Procurement of 200 MT of Butene-1 from M/s Reliance on nomination basis for BCPL Lepetkata	M/s Reliance Industries Limited, New Delhi	INR 2,60,73,044.00	<p>Prior to commissioning of plant, purchase order was issued on related party basis to M/s GAIL for supply of 5000 MT Butene-1 per annum for a period of 3 years on best endeavour / best availability basis, however, the supply from GAIL was not forthcoming, therefore, after commissioning of plant and subsequent operation phase, other sources were explored.</p> <p>Time to time purchase orders were issued to M/s RIL on sole participated and qualified bidder against open domestic competitive e-bidding basis which had been executed by M/s RIL except the P.O. for 1800 MT Butene-1 placed in Sept'2016, citing the reason that their offer was on best availability/best endeavour basis.</p> <p>M/s IOCL was also contacted to supply Butene-1, but initially regretted citing the reason that there is no spare-able quantity for sales. However, on repeated persuasion M/s IOCL, New Delhi has come forward for the first time to supply 100MT Butene-1 to BCPL in the month of April'2018 on PSU basis and against supply of 400 MT in the month of May'2018 and f 100 MT in the month of June'2018 and said quantity has already been lifted.</p> <p>Effort was also made to procure Butene-1 through ICB tender but the same had not yielded any fruitful result.</p> <p>As the supply of Butene-1 from M/s RIL and M/s GAIL was inconsistent/intermittent, effort was made to procure Butene-1 from M/s HPL who only had shown interest to supply Butene-1 on long term basis. Accordingly purchase</p>

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						<p>order for procurement of 6000 MT was issued to M/s HPL in Jan'2017 and the same was executed by July'2017. Effort was made again to persuade M/s HPL to maintain the supply of Butene-1 on continuous basis. Accordingly M/s HPL agreed to supply Butene-1 for a period of one year @ 1000 MT per month (minimum). Order was issued to M/s HPL in August'2017 for supply of 12000 MT per annum [@ 1000 MT per month] Butene-1 which is under execution.</p> <p>Purchase order was also issued to M/s OPaL in April' 2017 for supply of 6000MT Butene-1 for a period of one year on best endeavour /availability basis, but M/s OPaL after supply in April-May'2017 (492.5MT), had stopped supply of Butene-1 from June' 2017 to Oct' 2017 and again resumed supply in Nov-Dec'2017 (349.10MT) and thereafter completely stopped supply till date.</p> <p>The quantities being sourced from GAIL, HPL & OPaL are not sufficient to meet monthly requirement of Butene-1 which is around 1500-2000 MT to operate the plant in existing scenario at 90% to 100% capacity utilisation.</p> <p>Time to time various purchase orders with quantity 100-300 MT have been issued to M/s RIL on nomination basis to meet the monthly requirement of Butene-1 as a stop gap measure.</p> <p>Due to above efforts in sourcing of Butene-1, there is a marked improvement in capacity utilization of LLDPE unit since Jan'2017 which contributed to registering cash profits since Feb'2017 onwards.</p>

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						<p>ICB open tender floated in Nov'2016 for importing Butene-1 on term basis upto FOT BCPL Lepetkata site, remain inconclusive, as the bidders asked for repeated extension of bid due date and finally the said tender was closed in Feb'2017 due to non-acceptability of the sole bid received against the tender. Even 2nd ICB open tender floated in Oct'2017 on term basis upto Pipavav Port on CFR incoterm also remain inconclusive after repeated extension of bid due date and finally the said tender was closed in Feb'2018 due to no bid situation. However, against the 1st spot ICB open tendering, purchase order issued to the vendor M/s Dinowic Pte. Ltd., Singapore for 1500MT was not executed.</p> <p>To meet the monthly requirement of Butene-1 during the month of July' 2018, on persistent follow-up, M/s RIL had agreed to supply 200 MT Butene-1 on spot basis. Accordingly, purchase order was issued to M/s RIL on nomination basis which has been executed.</p>

Further budgetary offer of M/s OTPL was cheaper than

National Safety Council, Mumbai	INR 9,24,000.00	<p>After commissioning of BCPL since 02.01.2016, all the units i.e. Lepetkata, Lakwa, Duliajan & Pipeline Installations are in O&M phase. Various activities are being carried out for plant operations in these units. In order to assess the elements of Safety Management systems & also to implement best possible safety standards in the complex, External Safety Audit needs to be carried out by an independent/external agency of national repute.</p> <p>As per Assam Major Accident Hazard Control Rule, 1992 under Section 10(2), External Safety Audit needs to be carried out once in two years. As per letter received from PESO, External Safety Audit to be carried out once in a year as required under Rule 10 of MSIHC Rule, 1989. The aim of this Audit is to carry out Systematic critical examination of different units of BCPL with a view to find the gap in actual Operation & maintenance activities/scenario with respect to applicable standard</p>
